Our children have a strong tradition of outdoor learning at school. All children learn through practical activities including Forest School and outdoor activities, which take place regularly throughout the year.

We have a ratio of one computer per child, library and early years areas, interactive boards in every room and an enviable outdoor environment including a pond, yurt, woodland, field and gardens.
