<p>In Geography we will be looking at different religious festivals that happen at this time of year, including, Christmas, Diwali, Hanukah and Thanksgiving.</p> <p>In History we will be looking at why we have bonfire night and how people have celebrated it in the past.</p> <p>In Science we will be describing people who are familiar to us and learning how to take care of ourselves.</p> <p>In Expressive Arts and Design we will focus on:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Singing songs and nursery rhymes on a celebrations theme, explore fast and slow sounds, move to assorted music, select and choose instruments to represent and respond to stimulus eg. parts of stories, poems. 2. Preparing assorted foods using spoons and knives – cutting, slicing, spreading, mixing, 3. Exploring a variety of food stuffs using the senses. <p>In PSED we will focus on:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Firework safety and making safe choices. 2. Knowing which foods are healthy and making healthy choices. 3. Caring for our teeth. <p>In Physical Development we will focus on:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Developing the fundamental movement skills of travelling on feet/feet and hands, vertical jumping and landing, hopping, balancing on body parts, balancing using equipment and rolling in assorted ways. <p>In RE we will focus on:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Christmas – knowing the nativity story and the names of the people in the story. 2.
