| In Geography, we will be continuing our study of South America with a focus on |  |

In Science, we are learning about living things and their habitats, looking at life cycles, reproduction and habitats, including microhabitats.

In RE We will be finding out about another world faith: Sikhism. We will learn about Sikh beliefs and practices, and making comparisons to the beliefs of Christianity.

In Music we will continue out work on our notation skills and working on improvising and composing short melodies using glockenspiels.

In DT we will develop our sewing skills by designing and making a soft toy, linked to the creatures of the Amazon Rainforest. We will learn new stitches and how to use applique to decorate.

In Computing we will explore the concept of sequencing in programming through Scratch. It begins with an introduction to the programming environment. We will create their own programs, featuring sequences. The final project is to make a representation of a piano.
In Y5/6 we will be focussing on real-life projects through construction of programs.
