<p>In <b>Art</b> we will focus on:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Textile skills of weaving on simple looms - card and string</li> <li>2. Using the natural world of the ocean to provide inspiration.</li> </ol> <p>In <b>Music</b> we will focus on:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Developing the skills for singing an assortment of ocean themed songs.</li> <li>2. Exploring the musical concept of <b>duration</b> through instrumental work, simple graphic scores and compositions.</li> <li>3. Developing listening skills when responding to pieces of music.</li> </ol> <p>In <b>PSHE</b> we will focus on:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Recognising the dangers when around water and in the sun.</li> <li>2. Knowing the rules of water safety.</li> <li>3. Knowing how to keep safe in the sun.</li> <li>4. Exploring what baptism is and what it involves.</li> <li>2. Understanding why some people are baptised.</li> <li>3. Reflecting on what makes baptism special.</li> <li>4. Recognising that different faiths also celebrate the arrival of new babies.</li> </ol> <p>In <b>PE</b> we will focus on:- Athletics</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Throwing accurately for distance - underarm and overarm.</li> <li>2. Jumping for distance.</li> <li>3. Negotiating obstacle courses with speed and agility.</li> </ol> <p>In <b>History</b> we will focus on seaside holidays in the past. We will look at Victorian seaside holidays, plotting activities on a timeline, writing postcards and re-enacting a Victorian seaside holiday. We will then compare Victorian holidays to those in the 1950s and those today.</p> <p>In <b>Science</b> we will continue our work on everyday materials, looking at physical properties of materials and sorting.</p> <p>In <b>Computing</b> we will continue our work on digital photography.
